MAINTAINING & ENHANCING DOWNTOWN

Our **Environmental Maintenance** crew works to ensure that Downtown Syracuse is attractive, clean and accessible. We provide valuable services to business owners, property owners, and the community at large.

Services that our team focus on include litter control, maintaining street furnishings, beautification efforts, mowing grass, providing sidewalk plowing assistance in winter months*, removing graffiti, and more.

*Please note, although the Downtown Committee assists property owners by trying to provide a minimum clear path so that pedestrians are able to walk throughout downtown to access properties and amenities; in the city of Syracuse, sidewalk maintenance including snow clearing and removal is ultimately the responsibility of the property owner. The Downtown Committee of Syracuse, Inc. is not liable for injury incurred as a result of insufficient clearing/removal of snow by the property owner.

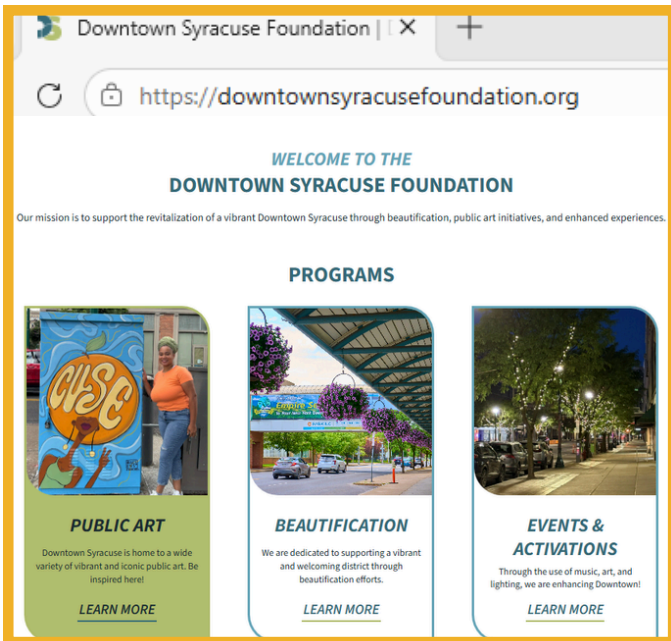
This year, the Downtown Committee of Syracuse invested in ArcGIS to **enhance the management of placemaking programs**. Using online mapping and data collection, this tool improves efficiency and initiatives through data mapping, leading to smarter decision-making for public spaces. Several elements that are mapped and tracked include Downtown trees, holiday wreathes, flower baskets, and cleaning zones.

MAINTAINING & ENHANCING DOWNTOWN

The **Downtown Syracuse Foundation** was established by the Downtown Committee of Syracuse to help secure resources to enhance the revitalization of the district. Thanks to this partnership, additional resources support beautification, public art and other activations. This year, the Downtown Syracuse Foundation launched a new website to highlight all of the impactful work being done.



Through a cost-sharing partnership with the City of Syracuse, Downtown Syracuse becomes **adorned with decorations for the holidays**, creating a festive atmosphere for visitors. Throughout the year, maintenance activities are carried out under a 50/50 cost-sharing agreement with the City to enhance the streetscape and make it more appealing.



Thanks to a NY Main Street grant secured by the Downtown Committee, street tree lights have been added to the 100-200 blocks of East Jefferson Street. Currently, **118 street trees** are enhanced throughout Downtown Syracuse with lights to help illuminate and connect Downtown's neighborhoods.

KEEPING DOWNTOWN SAFE

Our **Security** team's goal is to proactively address constituent needs to maintain Downtown's status of one of the **safest neighborhoods** in Syracuse. Our team responds to calls made to 423-HELP, conducts daily patrols Downtown, serves as a liaison with the Syracuse Police Department, organizes personal safety seminars, offers security audits to businesses, and distributes security information. We provide support for the Downtown Security camera program as well as address quality of life concerns through **collaborations** with human service and behavioral health agencies.

2026 DOWNTOWN SYRACUSE DEVELOPMENT FORECAST



The economic momentum continues to be felt throughout Greater Syracuse. In Downtown, the development pipeline is strong with a diverse portfolio of projects.

More than 1275 million across 22 development projects are currently underway or slated to begin this year in Downtown Syracuse. Included in these projects are enhanced amenities for residents, workers and visitors, cultural experiences, business renovations and expansions, and parking facility upgrades. More than 700 new residential units and 500 parking spaces are expected to come online because of these investments.

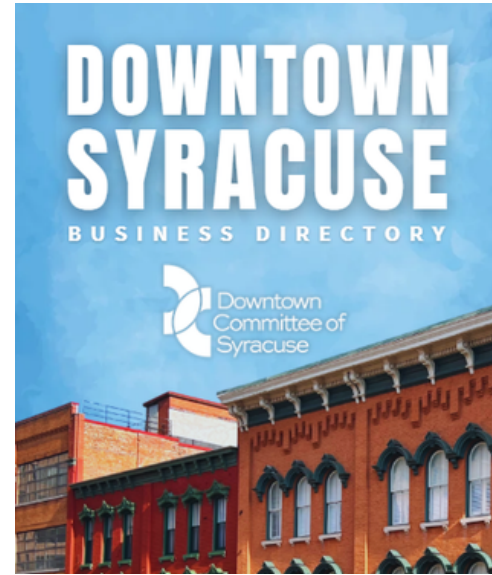

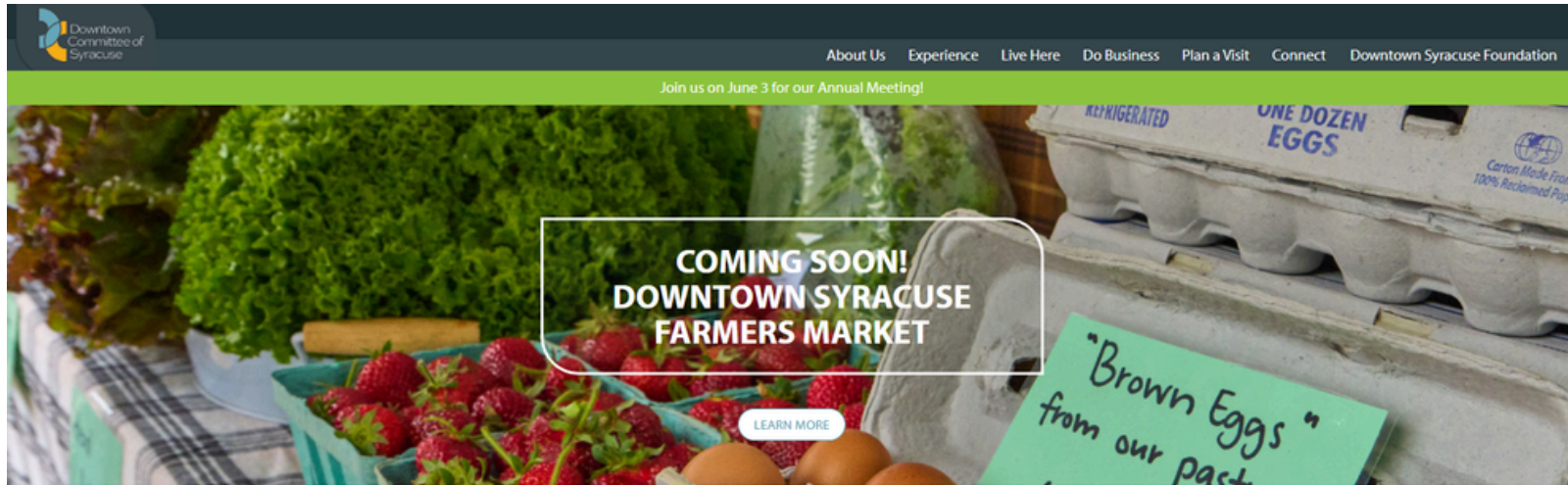

SIGNATURE EVENTS

The Downtown Committee of Syracuse hosts a series of **Signature Events** annually. Our goal with these events is to **showcase Downtown Syracuse** as a prime destination, attract visitors, support local businesses, educate on development trends, and get people excited about all that Downtown Syracuse has to offer.



SYRACUSE ARTS & CRAFTS FESTIVAL JULY 2025

In July, the **54th Annual Syracuse Arts & Crafts Festival**, presented by M&T Bank, showcased more than 140 artists and crafters from across the United States and Mexico. This family-friendly event attracted over 35,000 visitors to Columbus Circle, offering a chance to immerse themselves in Downtown's architecture, culture, and vibrancy.

DOWNTOWN FARMERS MARKET JUNE - OCTOBER 2025

The 2025 **Downtown Syracuse Farmers Market**, presented by Community Bank, showcased fresh produce, baked goods, and more from local farmers and vendors. For 19 Tuesdays in Clinton Square, visitors had the pleasure of enjoying lunchtime music while exploring the delightful offerings at the Farmers Market.



FALL PROGRESS BREAKFAST OCTOBER 2025

The **Fall Progress Breakfast**, presented by National Grid, marked the conclusion of our 50th Anniversary celebration. This event featured speakers who highlighted Syracuse's journey through the past, present, and future, along with a presentation that covered all of the thrilling developments taking place in Downtown.

DOWNTOWN SYRACUSE DINING WEEKS MARCH 2026

Food enthusiasts enjoyed good eats and sweet deals at over 50 participating locations during the **22nd Downtown Syracuse Dining Weeks**, presented by Visions Federal Credit Union. This annual event invited individuals to discover the diverse dining choices in Downtown Syracuse while supporting local restaurants during the quieter winter season.



SPRING SPOTLIGHT SERIES MARCH 2026

Formerly known as the Progress Breakfast Series, in Spring 2026 we launched the new **Spring Spotlight Series**, presented by Canandaigua National Bank. The theme of this event was “Growing Downtown” and it showcased speakers who are actively contributing to the vibrancy and development of Downtown Syracuse.

EARTH DAY CLEANUP APRIL 2026

Our annual **Earth Day Cleanup** engaged more than 200 volunteers within Downtown Syracuse. They helped to give back to the community by collecting litter throughout various neighborhoods in the central business district.



OPEN UP DOWNTOWN MAY 2026

To better connect the community with our district and help showcase all that Downtown offers, we introduced a new event, **Open Up Downtown**. Eventgoers purchased tickets to gain exclusive behind-the-scenes access to eight tour stops and four informational stops throughout Downtown Syracuse. Participants explored historic buildings and saw new spaces that are typically not accessible to the public. We welcomed over 900 people to this inaugural event!

EXPERIENCE DOWNTOWN SYRACUSE FOR THE HOLIDAYS CAMPAIGN

SHOP DOWNTOWN PASSPORT

This holiday season, we introduced our inaugural Shop Downtown Passport. From November 28 to January 5, customers who made a purchase at any of the over 30 participating businesses received a sticker for their Passport. Once the Passport was filled with stickers, it could be submitted to enter a drawing for a Downtown-themed gift basket. This initiative encouraged people to patronize a variety of restaurants and shops in Downtown.



WINDOW WONDERLAND CONTEST

To enhance the overall holiday experience, windows throughout Downtown were decorated with festive, seasonal displays. Community members cast over 2,000 votes while strolling through the area to select their favorite design. This year, more than 50 ground-floor businesses took part in the Window Wonderland Contest.

HOLIDAY IN HANOVER

On December 6, we hosted a festive day filled with family friendly activities, made possible through our partnership with Community Bank. Four hundred visitors savored free hot cocoa, delightful cookies from Sweet Praxis, and enjoyed complimentary ice skating along with tickets to the Erie Canal Museum's Gingerbread Gallery, all while exploring the charming shops and restaurants in Hanover Square.



STUDENT ART IN DOWNTOWN SYRACUSE

This year we launched an exciting new project that activated the streetscape along the 300 and 400 blocks of South Salina Street and showcased the artistic talents of some of Syracuse's youngest community members! Throughout December, Pre-K classrooms in local schools channeled their creativity to produce Student Art in Downtown Syracuse. It was wonderful to see families coming into Downtown to view their young artists' creations on display!



ANNUAL MEETING

Our **Annual Meeting**, presented by Community Bank, N.A. served as a celebration of announcements, individuals, projects, and locations that have played a significant role in the growth, diversity, and vibrancy of Downtown. We shared the State of Downtown Report, and honored businesses, organizations, and individuals with the **Awards of Excellence**, presented by National Grid.



PERFECT PARTNER AWARD ONONDAGA HISTORICAL ASSOCIATION

The Perfect Partner Award recognizes those whose initiatives positively impact Downtown Syracuse. Originally incorporated in 1863, the Onondaga Historical Association, located at 321 Montgomery Street, collects and preserves historical material of Onondaga County. OHA educates the community on Downtown's history through exhibits, public tours, and educational programs. The team inspires understanding that our shared history is the foundation for our future together.

URBAN INNOVATION AWARD ELITE GAMING

The Urban Innovation Award recognizes trail-blazing activity in a previously undeveloped area of Downtown Syracuse. Co-founders Rob O'Connor and Matt Guernsey expanded ELITE Gaming's state-of-the-art facility to the Atrium Building after outgrowing their previous location. ELITE Gaming connects gamers of all skill levels through competitive gaming, fun, education, and new experiences, bringing new energy to the area while working with local partners to support community events.



HEART OF DOWNTOWN AWARD ALLY WALKER

The Heart of Downtown Award recognizes efforts that positively affect how people feel about Downtown Syracuse. Ally Walker is a local mural artist whose colorful work brightens many familiar public spaces throughout the district. During winter months, she paints dozens of Downtown windows in festive designs as part of our Window Wonderland Contest. Ally has also been selected as the artist for two UNBOXED: Utility Box Art Projects, a Downtown Syracuse Foundation program. Her contributions to public art help to create a warm, welcoming environment that celebrates the spirit of the district.



DOWNTOWN SYRACUSE VISION AND STRATEGIC ACTION PLAN

This Spring we formally kicked off the **Downtown Syracuse Vision and Strategic Action Plan initiative**. Working with CZB as our lead consultant, and guided by a project steering committee, the goal of the Vision Plan is to build upon the significant residential, commercial, and cultural revitalization efforts of the last 20 years and deliver a clear 10-year vision for Downtown Syracuse, with a prioritized 5-year strategic action plan.

One of Syracuse’s greatest assets is its people and we’re looking forward to working with our community to develop a cohesive vision for Downtown’s continued growth. Our goal is to have the final report completed by the end of the year.

Our mission is to improve Downtown Syracuse by strengthening its economic base, increasing its attractiveness, and assuring that it's clean, safe and accessible.

The Downtown Committee is a private, not-for-profit, professional Downtown management organization that represents all property owners and tenants within the central business district. Our team is committed to fostering a clean, safe, welcoming, and vibrant downtown community. We provide our services to all who are located in the downtown district or are considering a move to Downtown.



FINANCIAL REPORT

The following outlines the sources of our budgeted revenue and expenses by program for fiscal year July 1, 2025, through June 30, 2026. In addition to the special assessment, our revenue is generated from ticket sales, sponsorships, and special programs, all of which contribute to enhancing our program delivery for Downtown Syracuse.
